Empathy is the practice of sharing another person's feelings.

Empathy is a vital part of qualitative research. And the business cycle.

But it doesn't always come naturally. Challenges to empathy can include:

- Feeling limited by your own experiences
- Inability to connect without similarities to, or relationships in common, with the person
- It needing 100% of your attention

Developing empathy takes practice.



- Listen more than you speak
- Don't make assumptions
- Look for emotional queues
- Put yourself in their shoes
- Find moments of connection, if you can

The right preparation makes it easier to engage with users.

Set expectations

- Set expectations with every touchpoint
- Be clear about what you will be discussing, and how the session will work
- Communicate how and when you say you will

Thank you for taking the time to speak with me today. My name is xx and I'm on the xx team here at the Skimm. Just a few things before we get started:



The best insights require us to dive below the surface.

It won't always be smooth sailing

Which is why practice is so important.



Going off script.

Sticking to your script is important, but it's not the only way to derive insights.

Acting impartially is important, but empathy builds trust and rapport.



What can we learn from what they're offering?

My husband died yesterday, and I've never even written a cheque before. I don't know what I'm going to do. I know you had questions for me but I was hoping I could ask you some questions.

My wife doesn't know it, but I lost nearly half of our retirement funds by stock-picking. I just love the thrill of it, and I used to be really good at it. I know it will be okay. I love the thrill of it, you know?

Sometimes, you're an ear or a shoulder

I have a friend who just... is always happy. Like, I don't get it. She never yells at her kids, she's always calm, and I know it's wrong but it makes me hate her.
What do you mean you never yell at your kids?!

I had a miscarriage a couple of weeks ago, and I'm really struggling. My husband is great, but he doesn't understand how I'm feeling, you know? And we've just had such a hard time with all of it.
